The Te Auaha Pito Mata Awards celebrate the impact of emerging community researchers in Aotearoa. They shine a light on rangatahi and researchers in the first 1–8 years of their careers whose work uplifts communities and strengthens knowledge for positive change.

- The awards recognise excellence and raise the profile of the recipients, their research projects, community research and diverse ways of knowing.
- Recipients are provided with travel to the in-person Awards ceremony in Te Whanganui-a-Tara where category judges, research, sector and community leaders can connect to affirm and champion the unique value of community research.
- The awards help foster career progression for emerging researchers.

THE AWARD CATEGORIES

The awards profile outstanding research across four categories:

- Tangata Whenua Community Researcher
- Pasifika Community Researcher
- **Ethnic Community Researcher**
- **Community Researcher**

A further category: **The honorary Billie Award**, is bestowed in recognition of strengths-based research or evaluation.

For these awards, researcher refers to people who have conducted community research or evaluation (either individually or as part of a wider team) either through academic studies, volunteering or their work.
